



COVID-19 Testing

CDC Guidelines

- If you believe you were exposed to COVID-19 or have symptoms, you should **quarantine at home for 5 days before testing** and wear a mask around others.
- If you test positive, you should quarantine at home for a minimum of 5 days. If you have no symptoms, or if your symptoms are resolving, you can leave your house after 5 days, but should continue to wear a mask around others and socially distance for an additional 5 days.
- If you test positive, but cannot quarantine at home, you should wear a mask around others and socially distance for 10 days.
- Contact your medical provider for further guidance, or if you have severe symptoms; if you do not have a medical provider, [The Wright Center](#) and [Scranton Primary Health Care](#) serve uninsured and underinsured Lackawanna County Residents.

Starting 1/15	Ongoing	Request reimbursement from your health insurance provider for out-of-pocket costs for COVID tests	New Federal government requirement	<p>Private health insurers are now required to cover the cost of 8 at-home COVID-19 tests per month for each covered member. While you may be able to get it covered at the point of purchase, you will likely need to pay for the tests out-of-pocket then file for reimbursement from your health insurance provider.</p> <p>You will not have to meet a deductible for reimbursable expenses.</p> <p>Those covered by Medicaid and Children’s Health Insurance Program (CHIP) are eligible for reimbursement; check with these providers for reimbursement instructions.</p> <p>Medicare participants and uninsured individuals are <u>not eligible</u> for this option.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. If you pay out-of-pocket for at-home COVID-19 tests at any point on or after Jan. 15, 2022, keep your receipt as your proof of purchase. 2. File a claim for reimbursement through your health insurance provider. (Call the number on your insurance card or check your provider’s web site for instructions.) 3. If your insurance provider has set up a way for you to get a COVID-19 test without paying up front, then you will be reimbursed up to \$12 per test. If your insurer has not set up its own network or way for you to get the test through them, they’ll owe you the full cost of the test kit, even if it’s more than \$12.
