Kick COVID-19 Community Corps Moving & Shaking

Early this year, Lackawanna County, the City of Scranton and 20 community partners, joined forces to form **Kick COVID-19 Community Corps** ("Community Corps") – a grassroots collaborative made up of local health care providers, social service agencies, faith groups, cultural organizations, economic and educational institutions, and dedicated volunteers. As member of the HHS COVID-19 Community Corps, Kick COVID-19 Community Corps supports the national <u>We Can Do This</u> campaign.

Community Corps focuses on unified information sharing and public education about COVID-19 and the available vaccines. While we work to reach as many people as possible, we prioritize our most vulnerable populations, including the elderly, non-native English speaking, minority, medically homebound and economically disadvantaged residents. In addition to sharing clear and simple messaging that empowers, we motivate people to be vaccinated and connect them with nearby opportunities.

Thanks to Lackawanna County Commissioners Jerry Notarianni, Debi Domenick, and Chris Chermak, Scranton Mayor Paige Gebhardt Cognetti, and State Rep. Bridget Malloy Kosierowski, who signed on to our big ideas early and immediately saw the value that an organized effort could have on the region's ability to bring the pandemic under control. The County invested significant resources establishing a central staging location for large, publicly accessible vaccine clinics, and funded many of our activities, including a series of public service announcements. Demonstrating their willingness to put skin in the game, these leaders are wonderful examples of government working effectively for the people.

This month, Community Corps will launch our PSAs (see a few pics, at right). Along with the efforts of so many, we believe our work is paying off. **As of June 8, 105,791** Lackawanna residents are fully vaccinated, and another 19,174 have one of two shots needed. Yet, there's work to do!

Kick it to the Curb, June 18, Downtown Scranton

Community Corps is hosting *Kick it to the Curb, a Celebration of Community Action,* on Friday, June 18, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., at the Scranton Cultural Center. The event features a free vaccine clinic for ages 12 and older, and a free fresh food market, where guests can select from a variety of fruits, vegetables, milk, meat and other products, plus prizes and giveaways. Anyone eligible (age 12+) who is not yet vaccinated is strongly encouraged to attend. Appointments can be made at https://bit.ly/3naklgR, and transportation assistance will be available. Call 211 for help scheduling a vaccine (including medically homebound residents in Lackawanna County) and/or transportation. We will also welcome walk-ins.
